

LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR



Dear Friends.

Thank you for joining us for the 37th anniversary season of José Mateo Ballet Theatre's presentation of The Nutcracker.

Our artistic, administrative and production teams have been hard at work for the last several months to weave the distinctive magic of the holiday classic and it is with great pleasure that I extend a warm welcome to you on this special occasion.

I've always attributed the enduring popularity of this wonderful ballet to Peter Tchaikovsky's magnificent score, one of the most recognizable masterpieces of western music that on its own has become a part of holiday traditions around the globe.

JOSE MATEO BALLET THEATRE'S THE NUTCRACKER

Published in 1819, E.T.A.
Hoffman's Nutcracker and
Mouse King was the source
of inspiration for the first
production of The Nutcracker
ballet, set to Peter Tchaikovsky's
magnificent score by
St. Petersburg's Mariinsky
Theatre in 1892.

José Mateo Ballet Theatre's version of what has become the most widely performed ballet in the world was choreographed in 1988 and continues to honor the classical tradition. It is presented in the company's hallmark style characterized by simplicity and dynamism. Mateo's Nutcracker has become a favorite New England tradition that conjures the beauty, magic and spirit of the holidays like no other.





THE NUTCRACKER STORY

In anticipation of the upcoming holiday celebration, Clara dreams of a tall ethereal tree attended by magical fairies who deliver a mysterious gift.

Meanwhile, Dr. Drosselmeyer, a marvelous magician and friend to all children, is in his workshop preparing two of his mechanical dolls Columbine and Harlequin, that will entertain the guests at the Silberhaus party. He will also bring a special gift to Clara: a wooden doll shaped like a brave soldier, which he believes to be his grandnephew, a prince who long ago was turned into a Nutcracker by an evil sorcerer. Dr. Drosselmeyer is determined to undo the spell and contrives the plan that will ultimately free the prince and change Clara's life.

Clara's dream is realized at the party the next evening, when Dr. Drosselmeyer brings her the enchanted Nutcracker doll that immediately captures her devoted attention. While Clara is not looking, the boys sneak the Nutcracker away from her and break it. To keep his secret plan on course, Dr. Drosselmeyer promptly mends the broken toy and suggests it remain in Clara's close care.

The hour is late and it is Clara's bedtime; however, she is unable to sleep for she is too busy thinking about her lovely little Nutcracker. She returns to the parlor to look for her new toy. Instead, she is surprised by an army of giant mice, who taunt her. Just then, Dr. Drosselmeyer appears and casts a spell bringing to life the Nutcracker and toy soldiers to protect Clara.

At first, the battle does not go well for the soldiers. The end appears near for the Nutcracker, when Clara unexpectedly comes to his rescue and slays the evil Rat King. Then, to Clara's amazement, her toy Nutcracker turns into a real prince. In gratitude for her having come to his defense, he invites her to the magical Kingdom of the Sweets.

Clara and the Prince travel through the enchanted forest of the dancing snow-flakes and arrive at the Kingdom of the Sweets where they visit the delicious palace of the Sugar Plum Fairy. Here, Clara is entertained by waltzing flowers and costumed dancers from distant lands representing delightful confections. As their guest of honor, Clara is also treated to a culminating performance by the Sugar Plum Fairy and her Cavalier.

This is the magic of The Nutcracker!



Founded in 1986, José Mateo Ballet Theatre consisted of a performance company that became one of America's leading producers of new ballets, an innovative ballet school, and the originator of Dance for World Community™, an initiative that has elevated the role of dance in the Greater Boston area. Over the past 40 years, Cuban-born Founder/Artistic Director José Mateo has developed his unique vision to create a new model for an inclusive and socially responsible ballet organization that engages today's diverse audiences.

THE COMPANY

Praised by local and national critics and hailed by *Boston* magazine as "*Best Dance Troupe*" in 2018, the company regularly presented Mateo's highly acclaimed concerts at its Sanctuary Theatre in its home at Old Cambridge Baptist Church in Harvard Square. Its presentation of Mateo's treasured version of *The Nutcracker* at The Strand Theatre in Dorchester offers an intimate, dancefocused experience that is affordable and universally accessible.

THE SCHOOL

With studios in Cambridge and Dorchester, the School offers an innovative model for a high-quality academy with a humanistic approach to ballet training that fosters diversity and inclusion. The Young Dancers Program provides expert training for students ages 3-18. Introductory courses are also offered to both Teenagers and Adults seeking to learn ballet at a later age. Finally, the School has a robust adult ballet program with the popular drop-in classes for all levels.

DANCE FOR WORLD COMMUNITY™

Created in 2008, Dance for World Community is a partnership-based initiative that amplifies the potential for the connective power of dance to unify and strengthen our local communities.

Dance for World Community makes dance accessible to thousands of children, families, and new audiences through several year-round outreach programs and its flagship event, the annual **Dance for World Community Festival** in June, a multi-stage indoor/outdoor festival in Harvard Square.

The 15th Annual Dance for World Community Festival will be held on June 6, 2026 with over 20,000 attendees of all ages expected to enjoy free performances and classes in a diverse array of dance forms.







JOSE MATEO FOUNDER & ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Cuban-born choreographer José Mateo founded José Mateo Ballet Theatre (JMBT) (incorporated in 1986 as Ballet Theatre of Boston, Inc.) in 1987 with the company's debut performance of *New Paces* featuring his original ballets at Dorchester Strand Theatre. For four decades, he has led the organization as Artistic Director, choreographing a wide repertory of original ballets (over 100) — including a celebrated annual production of The Nutcracker — and directing a year-round ballet school, dedicated to providing a humanistic approach to inclusive high-quality ballet training.

Mateo also created Dance for World Community, an initiative launched in 2009 to harness the connective power of dance to advance social change, featuring an annual free festival in Harvard Square. In 2025, he designed the inaugural Dance for World Community Conference, and the program is launching an online Community Forum to connect dancers and activists across the world.

Mateo holds a BA in Art History from Princeton University where he began his formal training in ballet and modern dance techniques. After a New York-based career as a dancer, Mateo moved to Boston where he worked as an administrator at Harvard University's Fogg Art Museum as he quickly gained a reputation as a prominent ballet teacher and choreographer. JMBT

presentations of his choreographic works have been recognized alongside international touring companies in The Boston Globe's "10 Best Dance Events" in 1990, 1995, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, and 2008.

In recognition of his artistic and civic contributions, Mateo has received numerous awards. Most recently, in October 2024, he received the Eric Oddleifson Arts Learning Service Award from Arts Learning for "his artistic and educational leadership in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts." Other awards include:

- 2005: Barr Fellowship, inaugural class, Barr Foundation
- 2007: recognized as one of 100 most influential people in the Hispanic community in MA
- 2012: Jorge Hernández leadership award - Inquilinos Boricuas en Acción
- 2012: Peace and Justice Award -Cambridge Peace Commission
- 2012: Dr. Michael Shannon Dance Champion-Boston Dance Alliance
- 2016: named one of Boston's 50 Legends and Pioneers by Boston's Get Konnected
- 2017/18: Commonwealth Award for Achievement - the state's highest honor in the arts, sciences, and humanities.

Beyond his artistic work, Mateo has served on several nonprofit boards including Boston Cultural Council, Cambridge Arts Council, ArtsBoston, Boston Dance Alliance, Dance Umbrella, the Victoria Rowell Foster Children's Positive Plan, Homelessness Empowerment Project, MASSCreative and the Muniz Academy. He currently serves on the Boards of Friends of Caritas Cuba and Manship Artist Residency and is the Treasurer of the Cambridge Arts Council Fund. Through his service and leadership, Mateo continues to redefine the role of dance in building more connected, just, and vibrant communities.



MARY THOMPSON ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION & PERFORMANCE

Mary Thompson's early training was at the Boston Ballet School under the direction of founder E. Virginia Williams, where she trained until receiving a coveted Ford Foundation Scholarship to study at George Balanchine's School of American Ballet (SAB) in New York. In addition to dancing soloist roles in SAB's Annual Workshop performances, Ms. Thompson was invited to audition for, and subsequently joined Makarova and Company as a pre-professional dancer. An injury caused Ms. Thompson to take a

hiatus from dance, after which she rehabilitated with Marie Paquet in Boston and Finis Jhung in New York. Recovered, Ms. Thompson joined the Berkshire Ballet as a soloist where she quickly progressed to Principal status. While at Berkshire Ballet, and later at Ballet Michigan and South Carolina Ballet Theater, Ms. Thompson performed lead roles in many of ballet's more beloved classics. as well as pieces by Antony Tudor, Loyce Houlton and Francis Patrelle. In 1986, Ms. Thompson began studying with José Mateo and accepted his invitation to perform with and join the company. She soon began teaching at the school in both the Adult Open and Young Dancers programs, and was highly involved in the establishment of YouthWorks. Over the past four decades, Ms. Thompson has also taught for, and run other schools within the Boston area, however, the majority of her work throughout the years has been dedicated to JMBT, where she has served as Principal of the Young Dancers Program, Summer Program Director and Ballet Mistress for the company. This past year, Ms. Thompson was named Associate Director of Education and Performance for JMBT.



MATTHEW BRETTON LIGHTING DESIGN

Matthew Breton (lighting designer) has been working with the José Mateo Ballet Theatre for nearly two decades. This is his eighth year overseeing the design for "The Nutcracker," including the "Tribute to the Nutcracker" presented in 2021. He has also designed for Mr. Mateo's repertory performances, the Dance for World Community festival, and the Dance Saturdays performances at the Sanctuary Theater. In addition to his work as lighting supervisor for numerous Boston theaters. Mr. Breton has designed performances for Jean Appolon Expressions (Summer 2024 at The Yard), Janelle Gilchrist Dance Troupe (November 2024 at the BCA) and Abilities Dance (November 2024 at the Strand). He has served as lighting supervisor for performances by Kyle Abraham/AIM, Complexions Contemporary Ballet, and Faye Driscoll. Upcoming performances include work with Salem State University, Unyted Stylez, Kelley Donovan and Dancers, and the Mark Morris Dance Group.

LAURA McPHERSON SCENIC DESIGNER & SCENIC CHARGE ARTIST

Lauren McPherson is a freelance IATSE United Scenic Artists member of Local #829 as a Scenic Designer. After 25 years in New England, has a new studio on the coast of NC. Also a member of IATSE Local #491, she works in the film industry. Design clients include: Orlando Rep., Anchorage Classical Ballet Academy, and Boston Academy of Music among others. She was resident designer for Mystic Scenic Studios and Seismic Scenic. Her MFA is from Boston University, and BFA from The University

of North Carolina's School of the Arts. She's taught at Bridgewater State College, Emerson College, and been a Visiting Lecturer for Boston Conservatory, Harvard's Radcliffe College, A. R. T. Brittany was born and raised in Jamestown, NY, where she received her early dance training with Monika Alch at the Chautauqua Regional Youth Ballet. She went on to continue her training at the SUNY Purchase Conservatory of Dance,

where she received her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree. In 2013 she joined Jose Mateo Ballet Theatre as an apprentice, and was promoted to a full company member the following year. During her five seasons with the company she danced featured roles in Mateo's original works including House of Ballet, Covens, Over and Over, Affairs, and The Nutcracker. After many years of teaching in and around Boston, Brittany took the role of Ballet Director at The Greater Boston School of Dance in 2022. She is excited to be back working with Mr. Mateo and the rest of the faculty for this year's production of the Nutcracker!

As a quest / freelance artist he's performed at The Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, Vail Dance Festival, Guggenheim Works and Process, Claudia Schreier and Dancers at the Joyce Theater, Joshua Beamish - Move The Company, Ja Malik/ Ballet Boy Productions, New Jersey Ballet, Tulsa Ballet, Ballet Noir, The Francesca Harper Project, Dianne McIntyre, New York Dance Theatre, Mobile Ballet, Wilmington Ballet, Austin City Ballet, The World Dance Gala, Chopin Festival in Poland, Summer Stage Central Park and Wideman-Davis Dance. Da' Von is currently an MFA candidate at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia. Da' Vons work, through all mediums and genres, activates the cultivation of oneself as a creative tool for self discovery and the emergence of work that functions as conduit for individual reflection as well as collective growth and transformation. LUISA JORGENSEN

Luisa is from Needham Massachusetts and began her ballet training at the Charles River Ballet Academy under the

direction of Emily Hrones Umland. At the age of seven, she started performing with José Mateo Ballet Theatre in The Nutcracker. At fourteen, Luisa was accepted into the Boston Ballet School's Professional Division, where she trained for four years under the direction of Miranda Weese and José Martín Trujillo. She has also attended summer intensives at The School of American Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, The Royal Ballet (London), Boston Ballet, Bolshoi Ballet, and José Mateo Ballet Theatre. During her time with Boston Ballet, Luisa performed in Next Generation productions, appearing in excerpts from Coppélia, Le Corsaire, and The Sleeping Beauty, as well as in Mikko Nissinen's The Nutcracker. OLIVIA KACZMARZYK

Olivia Kaczmarzyk, a native of Providence, RI, began her ballet training at Ballet RI (formerly

Festival Ballet Providence) at the age of six. By 14, she was performing alongside the company corps de ballet in productions of The Nutcracker and The Sleeping Beauty before officially joining the company at 17. Olivia performed soloist roles in works by Viktor Plotnikov and Christopher Wheeldon and has danced iconic Balanchine ballets including Allegro Brillante, Rubies, and Serenade. She is now a freelance artist in the Boston area and a company dancer with Janelle Gilchrist Dance Troupe. In addition to performing, Olivia works as a classical Pilates instructor, bringing her deep understanding of movement and technique to her teaching.



YUTONG LI

Yutong Li was born in China and began her dance training at a young age at a local studio in her hometown. At the age of

11, she continued her formal ballet studies at the Shenyang Conservatory of Music. Rico. After a few years, he started dancing as a professional dancer with the company Ballet Brío, and then he moved to Ballet Concierto de Puerto Rico as a company dancer and choreographer as well. In 2021, Villareal was selected as a ballet master to work with the Syracuse City Ballet in New York, and as Costume Manager for "The Nutcracker 2021". Later, back on the island as an independent artist, he performed in "West Side Story", "Evita" and "Shrek" with the Musical Theater Company BAS Entertainment. His repertoire includes: "The Nutcracker", "Swan Lake", "Don Quijote", "A Midnight Summer Dream", "Carmen", "Pharaon's Daughter", "Giselle", "Paso a Tres," "Coppelia PDD," "The Dying Swan," among other pieces from the classical and contemporary repertoire. Ballet Theatre in Boston, In 2015 she ioined Ballet Concierto de Puerto Rico as an apprentice where she performed various productions such as Phantom of the Opera, Coppelia and many other repertoire pieces. In 2018 she joined the New York Dance Project in New York in which she performed various repertoire pieces by Robert Joffrey, Gerald Arpino and many other renowned choreographers.
